and says he "can fake his way through the rest of the brass family, when need arises." One of his brothers plays trumpet and tuba, and his youngest brother plays trombone and euphonium. "My mother likes to tease us for the amount of mouthpieces we've accumulated over the years," Tim said.

Tim played in almost every school band possible. He says he started playing in the high school jazz band when he was still in middle school, and by the time he was in college, he was regularly performing with several groups, including Pacific Crest Drum Corps, the University of California, San Diego wind ensemble, the UCSD pep band, Muir Musical, and others. He also started teaching marching bands in his spare time.

When asked if he had ever had dreams of becoming a professional musician, Tim said, "When I was younger, I always wanted to play movie music. I liked to imagine playing trombone with Denis Wick for the London Symphony Orchestra, belting out 'Star Wars' fanfares. Now I primarily just want to play for fun as a hobby." Some of his favorite styles of music vary, from classical to jazz to ska (which originated in Jamaica in the late 1950s, a precursor to reggae). But he said what he really looks for in music are good motifs and counterpoint. Other than his father, Tim said a couple of his favorite trombone players include Denis Wick, for his spectacular performances, and Glenn Miller, for his band and his music.

Tim said other than playing music, his hobbies include playing games, teaching and visiting national parks. "It's an honor having the chance to play with the LAPD Band," he said. "It's a fantastic group, and I love getting to play with such talented musicians."

Until Tim finds his place in the world of computational linguistics, the Band is so happy he's chosen to share his time and talent with them.
