The first of his family to play a musical instrument, Misha completed high school and auditioned for Music College. At 17 years old, while attending college, he auditioned for the Kiev National Orchestra and played with this orchestra for three years. Then he was drafted for mandatory military service, and for the next two

years, while in the Army, he played in the Army band.

After completing his Army service, Misha began to play as the principal trombonist for the National Orchestra of Ukraine. Also at this time, he simultaneously obtained his doctorate degree in music, which was a five-year program.

In 1990, as a refugee from the Soviet Union, Misha immigrated to the United States. Upon his arrival, he began to freelance as a trombone player and began teaching all levels of brass instruments. He also attended the music program at the University of Southern California. In addition to all of his musical endeavors and accomplishments, Misha has been a professional massage therapist for the past 20 years

When asked if he was inspired to play the trombone by anyone, he said it was just the instrument that grabbed his attention. But he said he is inspired
