## **LAPD** Concert Band



In every organization there is a mission statement, motto, etc. that describes the goals and objectives of that organization. The LAPD Band's motto is "To Perform and Serve." The person who translates that from words to actions, better than anyone else, is our own Christina Challey. Maybe she promotes the spirit of the Band from her cheerleading days as a former Oakland Raiderette. or her organizational skills through her education. As Director of Operations of the

Los Angeles Police Concert Band, she is responsible for a vast array of duties. These include working with the executive director and music director/conductor to insure good musician relations; assisting with recruitment; working on scheduling, production, budgeting, guest artist negotiations, venue and event management; working to build sponsorship and donor relationships; overseeing the music library. She is also the representative and spokesperson for the Band's community relations. To accomplish all that, she relied on her education, graduating from

In addition to her administrative duties. Christina is the Band's vocalist/producer. In 1996, on the Band's trip to Stockholm, Sweden, to perform for the World Police Games, she was an invited guest to meet King Gustav. Another time she performed with her Band trio at the Kennedy Center and World War II Memorial in Washington, D.C.

Where did she get all this talent, and why the Band? Having been raised in Sacramento by a former lieutenant in the Marines and a creative mother, she loved the LAPD and wanted to give back to

the community. Her qualifications were acting, dancing and singing in musical theater, and appearances on national TV. (Her great influence in dancing came from Martha Graham.) After a brief audition, she was 'hired'. Soon, Christina was asked to be the vocalist in the swing band. Then, she was asked to be a member of the Los Angles Police Band Executive Committee, the governing board of the Band. A final request was that she be the Band producer because of her professional background. As a volunteer Band member, she was also required to attend recruit graduations once a month.

During her time with the Band, Christina has produced and starred in many Band productions. In association with USC, she co-produced a show at the Shrine Auditorium for the Los Angeles Police Department honoring the Children of Los Angeles, In addition, Christina
