Ron played in jazz and concert bands all throughout high school and college. He financed his college education by playing music. Ron spent the first three years of his college education in Santa Barbara and graduated with a degree in Music Education from the University of Montana. After college, Ron auditioned for and was accepted into the U.S. Naval School of Music in Washington, D.C. where he served as a full-time musician and repair tech.

Ron's tour of duty with the Navy Band took an amazing turn when he became part of a specially selected group of musicians to serve for the Commander, Naval Air Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet (the world's largest fleet command encompassing 100 million square miles). Ron said the musicians were the admiral's own "personal band," and the band would go wher-

ever the admiral went. This meant Ron spent 22 months with tours on the aircraft carriers USS Kitty Hawk, USS Constellation, the USS Bennington and the USS Ranger.
